reland's longest-running chamber music festival is back, bringing with it a line-up of truly celebrated international and home-grown artists, stimulating chamber music and exciting artistic collaborations. The planning of this event during the dark winter months always lifts our spirits with the thought of warm, sunny summer evenings and wonderful music in some of Ireland's most attractive spaces. We hope you agree that the 2024 Dublin International Chamber Music Festival, taking place from June 4th to 9th inclusive, promises another mouth-watering banquet of world-class performers, inspiring programmes and interesting venues.

With funds from The Arts Council, we have commissioned one of Ireland's most innovative compositional voices, Ann Cleare, to write an ambitious work for clarinet and string quartet. The work takes its inspiration from the fascinating surroundings of Dublin's Richmond Barracks in Inchicore and opens the 2024 event on June 4th. Undoubtedly a highlight of this year's programme, it will be performed in this fascinating space by the outstanding Irish clarinettist Carol McGonnell and JACK Quartet, one of world's leading experimental string quartets.

Anyone who experienced the music-making of the electrifying South African cellist, Abel Selaocoe with his Bantu Ensemble at Dublin Castle last year, will not be surprised by my enthusiasm to secure this extraordinary artist's return visit to the Festival. We are happy to partner with The Complex, in the heart of Dublin City, to once again present this trailblazing artist on June 5th.

Also on June 5th, this new venue to DICMF will host a cross-collaboration between art forms. Soprano Elizabeth Hilliard, composer David Bremner and visual artist Louise Manifold will present the world première of a powerful performance piece *Split Infinites* alongside Evangelia Rigaki's *Crush Bar* over three performances in the intimate setting of The Complex's Gallery.

We are proud to dedicate a day to highlighting the music of a vibrant roster of Black composers on June 8th in the stunning setting of Townhall, Windmill Qtr. Our three-concert day features an array of musical talent including clarinettist, EDI advocate and TEDx speaker Berginald Rash and a line-up of truly celebrated Irish pianists all of whom are synonymous with classical music-making in Ireland; Máire Carroll Thérèse Fahy, Ruth McGinley, Veronica McSwiney and Fionnuala Moynihan. In addition to presenting works by composers including Hannah Kendall, Florence Price, Adolphus Hailstork, Ed Bland and Tania Léon, we are excited to present a lunchtime concert featuring a number of works from the pen of the prolific, multi award-winning Belize-born British composer and performer, Errollyn Wallen.

We continue to present the core repertoire of the 18th to 20th centuries alongside new work. Irish pianist, Hugh Tinney collaborates with musician friends Adrian Brendel (cello). Katherine Hunka (violin) and Carol McGonnell (clarinet) in music by Brahms, Beethoven, Schubert and Deirdre Gribbin in the picturesque setting of Killruddery on June 9th. We are delighted to present the first Irish appearance of the Leonkoro Quartet, described by master pianist Alfred Brendel as "already one of the finest: perfectly unanimous, colourful and original". The Irish début of this thrilling young guartet will see its spirited members perform music by Brahms, Janáček and the Pultizer Prize-winning composer, Caroline Shaw in the verdant National Botanic Gardens on June 7th.

Accordionist Dermot Dunne joins forces with Altan's Martin Tourish for his own special arrangement of JS Bach's gargantuan *Goldberg Variations* at Casino Marino on June 6th, and this captivating artist, together with his musician colleagues, violinist, Katherine Hunka and double bass player, Malachy Robinson collectively known as the Far Flung Trio, presents a high energy family concert at Killruddery on June 9th.

Once again, we are pleased to offer early bird tickets for a number of concerts, and to present a number of free admission "bite-size" performances by the captivating duo, Dermot Dunne and Martin Tourish, on June 4^{th} .

With wonderful music performed by such an array of passionate musicians, we are sure that everyone will find something to satisfy their musical appetite.

DICMF is proud to open the 2024 iteration of Ireland's longestrunning chamber music festival with an ambitious new work for clarinet and string quartet by **Ann Cleare**. Commissioned by DICMF, with funds from The Arts Council, the work takes its inspiration from the iconic surroundings of Dublin's Richmond Barracks, a building of historical importance with over 200 years of military, political and social history located in Inchicore.

A recipient of a prestigious 2019 Ernst von Siemens Composer Prize, Ann Cleare is one of Ireland's most celebrated and innovative compositional voices. The world première of her work will be performed by acclaimed musicians, clarinettist **Carol McGonnell** and **JACK Quartet.**

All acknowledged champions of new music and deeply committed to commissioning new works, these exceptional musicians embrace close collaboration with the composers whose works they perform, leading to a radical embodiment of the technical, musical and emotional aspects of their work.

Ruth Crawford Seeger's String Quartet 1931 "a significant contribution to the canon of American modernism" (New York Times), Kaija Saariaho's *Duft*, commissioned by the Ernst von Siemens Music Foundation for the International Clarinet Competition Freiburg, and the Irish première of composer/pianist Juri Seo's Three Imaginary Songs also feature in this completing programme.

Soprano **Elizabeth Hilliard**, in collaboration with composer, **David Bremner** and visual artist, **Louise Manifold**, has created an impactful and dramatic performance experience *Split Infinites*, based on a collection of poems by the American poet Rosmarie Waldrop that feature a profusion of overflowing and branching syntax. Somewhere between concert-piece and installation, and including projections, electronics, sung text and materials, the work made by this highly creative team aims to immerse us in the world of these poems, conveying what Waldrop describes as "language being larger than us, not simply a tool that we are a master of".

The world première of this exciting new performance piece will be performed alongside an other-worldly video installation by Louise Manifold, *Crush Bar*. The installation was devised in collaboration with Elizabeth Hilliard and features music by Evangelia Rigaki.

For many years now, the Festival has proudly introduced exceptional musicians to Ireland. Major international ensembles who have made their Irish début with DICMF in recent seasons include the Ébène, Pavel Haas, Belcea, Doric and Modigliani string quartets. In 2024, we mark another Irish first with the captivating and award-winning **Leonkoro Quartet** described by Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung as an ensemble that "possesses an extraordinary stage presence, glows for the music, embraces full artistic risk, and astounds through their profound sensitivity towards the unique sonority of each piece".

Founded in 2019 in Berlin, in 2022 the Quartet garnered a series of prestigious accolades – including First Prize at the Wigmore Hall International String Quartet Competition, solidifying their place among the most celebrated ensembles of their generation. Since then the Leonkoro Quartet's career rise has been nothing short of meteoric with sensational débuts and criticallyacclaimed performances in prestigious venues including the Concertgebouw Amsterdam, London's Wigmore Hall and the Konzerthaus Wien.

A lunchtime concert shining the spotlight on the multi award-winning Belize-born British composer and performer, Errollyn Wallen "renaissance woman of contemporary British music" (The Observer). One of the top 20 most performed living composers of classical music in the world, Wallen was the first Black woman to have a work featured in the Proms and the first woman to receive an Ivor Novello Award for Classical Music for her body of work.

Matthew Sharp, a long-time collaborator with this prolific composer, joins forces with Irish pianist, **Dearbhla Brosnan**, for a selection of works including *Dervish*, a work commissioned by this joyous artist lauded for his 'freewheeling exuberance and blistering virtuosity' (BBC Music Magazine).

On this special occasion, we are delighted to partner with Sing Ireland for a special performance of Wallen's *Inherit the World*, a specially commissioned song for the climate change conference, COP 26, 2021. Under the baton of Irish conductor, Patrick Barrett, who led the world première of the work in Glasgow, the Irish Youth Training Choir will perform the first Irish performance of this powerful work, in addition to another equally effective work from the pen of Wallen, Peace on Earth.
